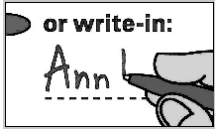
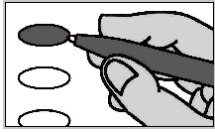


**OFFICIAL GENERAL ELECTION BALLOT**  
**NOVEMBER 8, 2022**  
**PORTAGE COUNTY, OHIO**

Kent City 1A

- **To vote:** completely darken the oval to the left of your choice. Use only a black or blue ballpoint pen. Do not use red ink.
- Note the permitted number of choices directly below the title of each candidate office. Do not mark the ballot for more choices than allowed.
- If you mark the ballot for more choices than permitted, that contest or question will not be counted.
- **To vote for a write-in candidate:** completely darken the oval to the left of the blank line and write in the candidate's name. Only votes cast for candidates who filed as write-in candidates can be counted.
- Do not write in a candidate's name if that person's name already is printed on the ballot for that same contest.
- **Before casting your ballot, if you make a mistake or want to change your vote:** return your ballot to an election official and get a new ballot. You may ask for a new ballot up to two times.

**Issue 1**

To require courts to consider factors like public safety when setting the amount of bail

**Proposed Constitutional Amendment**

Proposed by Joint Resolution of the General Assembly

To amend Section 9 of Article I of the Constitution of the State of Ohio

A majority yes vote is necessary for the amendment to pass.

**17 Proposed Ordinance (By Initiative Petition) Kent City**

A majority affirmative vote is necessary for passage.

Shall the proposed ordinance to lower the penalties for misdemeanor marijuana offenses be adopted?

The proposed amendment would:

- Require Ohio courts, when setting the amount of bail, to consider public safety, including the seriousness of the offense, as well as a person's criminal record, the likelihood a person will return to court, and any other factor the Ohio General Assembly may prescribe.
- Remove the requirement that the procedures for establishing the amount and conditions of bail be determined by the Supreme Court of Ohio.

If passed, the amendment will be effective immediately.

**Issue 2**

To prohibit local government from allowing non-electors to vote

**Proposed Constitutional Amendment**

Proposed by Joint Resolution of the General Assembly

To amend Section 1 of Article V, Section 3 of Article X, and Section 3 of Article XVIII of the Constitution of the State of Ohio

A majority yes vote is necessary for the amendment to pass.

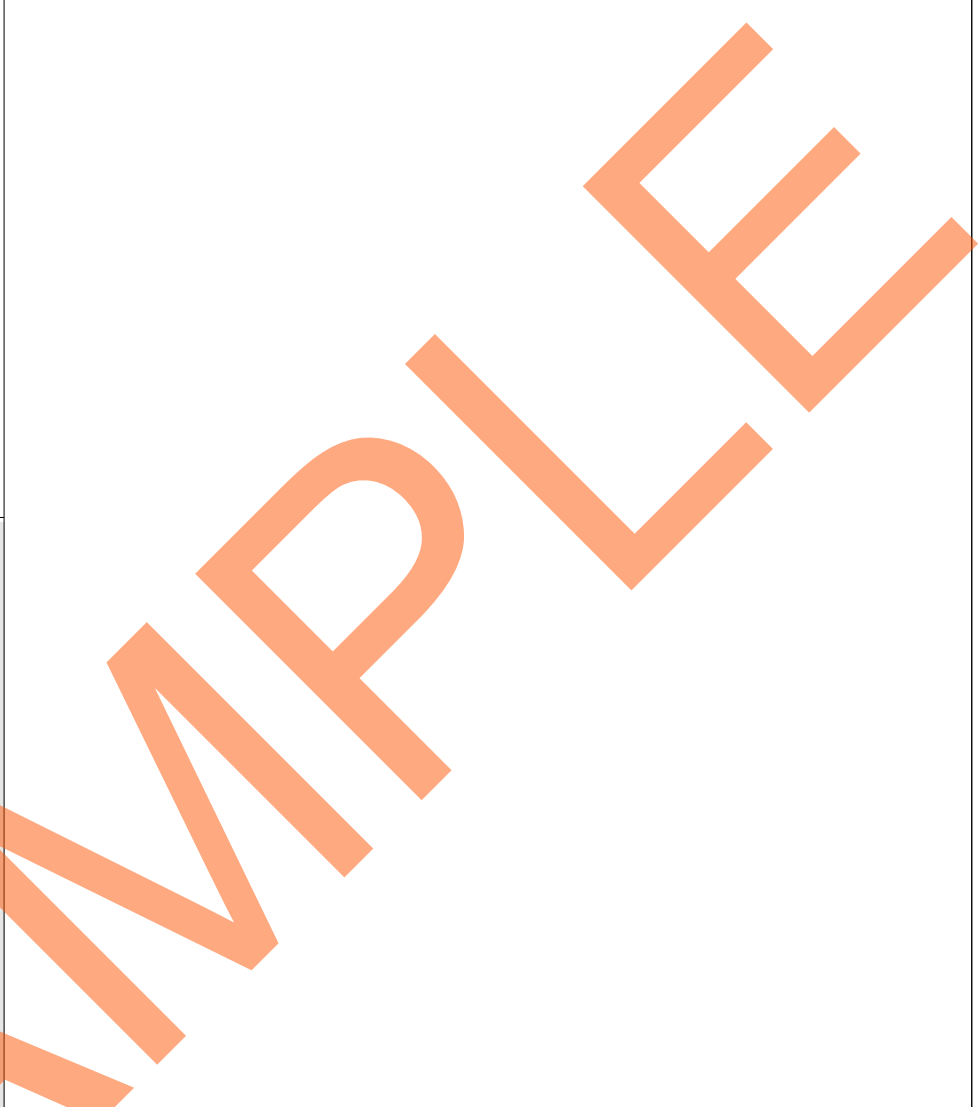
The proposed amendment would:

- Require that only a citizen of the United States, who is at least 18 years of age and who has been a legal resident and registered voter for at least 30 days, can vote at any state or local election held in the state.
- Prohibit local governments from allowing a person to vote in local elections if they are not legally qualified to vote in state elections.

If passed, the amendment will be effective immediately.
